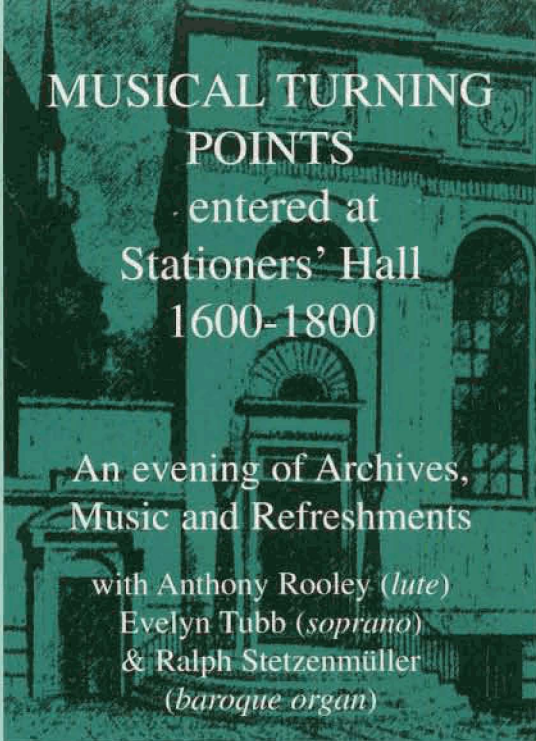

Stationers' Hall was a centre for music-making and registration of music in times past and, following our archive evenings on 'Copyright and Censorship' (2003) and 'Shakespeare at Stationers' Hall' (2005), we now offer a display in the Court Room of our early records featuring music entries, programmes of concerts held in the hall and musicians' bills for musical accompaniment to Court and Livery feasts. In addition, the Foundling Museum, the Royal Academy of Music and a private collector of St. Cecilia memorabilia are loaning copies of early music which will be on show alongside our own archival treasures. The Archivist and assistants will be on hand to answer questions.

Anthony Rooley, the world-renowned musicologist and performer of early music, will speak about English music and the role of Stationers' Hall as a focal point for entry and performance down the centuries. With Evelyn Tubb and Ralph Stetzenmüller, he will illustrate his talk with songs and music of the period taken from our registers.
